FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

- Garbage, Landfill, and Mini-Transfer and Recycling Transfer Station Schedules Residential curbside collection will resume for regularly scheduled Friday customers on Friday, October 11th. The Mid-County Mini-Transfer and Recycling Facility and the West Charlotte Mini-Transfer and Recycling Facility will reopen on the same day with an extended schedule from 9 a.m. to gates closing at 4:45 p.m. These facilities are open from Monday to Saturday. The Charlotte County Landfill will resume normal operating hours from 7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on Friday and from 7 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. on Saturday.
- The following restrictions apply at all mini-transfer stations and drop-off locations:
 - Proof of county residency is required. Residents need to bring a valid form of identification to include name, photo, and local address. - Two sand drop-off sites are open daily from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. at Englewood Beach and Don Pedro Knight Islands for flood-deposited sand left by Hurricane Milton
- FEMA Clean and Sanitize Assistance has been approved, limited to \$300 per eligible household, awarded as a one-time payment following a FEMA home inspection and determination of eligibility. Residents whose homes are habitable but require cleanup actions such as muck out, mold remediation, and limb clearing are eligible to apply for CSA, which is intended to address potential health and safety concerns and ensure minimal damage to homes is addressed to prevent additional losses. This program is not available automatically and must be requested and approved separately while applying for FEMA assistance.

This program is a free service for homeowners and permanently occupied rental properties, providing fiber-reinforced, industrial strength sheeting to protect storm-damaged roofs until homeowners can make permanent repairs. PERMITS

- Charlotte County Community Development Department reminds property owners that permits are required for storm damage repairs in accordance with Section 105.1 of the Florida Building Code. Storm-related repairs are NOT exempt from permitting requirements.
 - o If your home was flooded and more than 100 square foot of drywall was removed, a residential remodel permit is required.

- This requirement is in place to ensure that all repairs are conducted safely and meet the
 necessary building standards. Failure to obtain a permit may result in fines, additional repair
 costs, or issues when selling or insuring the property in the future.

- Work that can be Completed Without a Permit To streamline the rebuilding process and prevent delays, follow these guidelines on work that does not require a permit:
 - Removal of debris from on or inside a structure.
 - Minor demolition to prevent injury or prevent further damage to buildings. This includes removal of drywall that has been affected by flood water.
 - Structural shoring and bracing.
 - Repair of minor water leaks that do not involve structural, mechanical, or electrical systems.
 - Previously permitted fences destroyed by the storm may be re-installed, like for like, in the exact same location, except for fences used as a pool enclosure. Pool enclosure fence replacements must be reviewed for compliance with pool safety requirements.
